



The Declaration was finished and approved by Congress.

The text was finally delivered to Great Britain.

The 'Committee of Five' started writing the Declaration of Independence.






It became a holiday in 1870. Even if it was an important event, no anniversary was celebrated before, and the nation was finally united.

Not only did they both die on a 4th of July, but they also died the same year (1826 — the 50th anniversary of the approval of the Declaration).






Wild West Frontier Territorial expansion




After the Declaration of Independence, the USA still REMAIN a small 'nation'. The 13 colonies BECOME a country. But it HAVE to expand and push its frontier to the west.




The USA in the 1830s

By the 1830s, the USA COUNT 24 states from the east coast to the middle-west, that's because they had BUY Lousiana in 1803 (and DOUBLE their territory).



Finally the idea of a west 'frontier' BE progressively FORGET throughout the 19th century. The first west coast state to be BEAR was Oregon.




The biggest internal conflict in the US was the Civil War (1861-1865). The United States (in the north) FIGHT the Confederate States (in the south) who against the abolition of slavery.

So the nation had OVERCOME many different problems when in 1870, July 4th was declared a national holiday. It BRING a sense of unity throughout the country.
