

Compréhension écrite

Pour chaque question (en haut du cadre), utilise le document (à gauche) pour choisir la bonne réponse (à droite) en cliquant dans la case au début de cette réponse. Tu peux disposer d'une aide en cliquant sur ?

Les boutons en bas du cadre te permettent de naviguer d'une question à une autre (*previous* et *next*) et, si tu le souhaites, de vérifier la validité de ta réponse (*submit*).

Recommandations transversales pour la compréhension de l'écrit (1/2)

Comprendre un message, c'est comme **mener une enquête**: on cherche des indices, on les vérifie, on les rassemble et on les compare, puis on tire des conclusions. Comme dans une enquête, il peut rester des zones d'ombre, des choses qui demeurent inconnues, mais si on a suffisamment d'indices, on peut comprendre l'essentiel. Et comme tout bon détective, fais preuve de bon sens et fais confiance à ta logique.

Voici quelques conseils pour aborder le test de compréhension écrite et améliorer tes compétences de lecteur. Ils rejoignent certainement ceux, bien plus complets, que ton professeur te donne en classe :

- **Lis attentivement tous les éléments proposés** : le document, la question et les quatre propositions de réponses. Pour trouver la bonne réponse à la question, il est important de prendre en compte tous ces éléments ;
- Regarde attentivement la forme du texte : s'il y a des illustrations, quels indices donnent-elles ? À quoi ressemble le document ?
- **Appuie-toi sur la structure du texte** : s'il y a des paragraphes, rappelle-toi qu'on trouve normalement une idée principale dans chaque paragraphe ;
- Appuie-toi sur les **mots que tu connais déjà** mais aussi sur ceux qui **ressemblent au français**, qu'on appelle mots transparents, en gardant à l'esprit que certains mots transparents sont des « faux-amis » ;
- **Identifie des indices et mets-les en lien les uns avec les autres**. En effet, essaie de trouver plusieurs indices qui vont dans le sens de la réponse que tu envisages afin de vérifier que tu ne te trompes pas ;
- Appuie-toi sur les **répétitions** car un mot répété est souvent important ;
- Observe les **pronoms** (*I*, *me*, *he*, *him*...) et les **déterminants possessifs** (*my*, *your*...) et essaie de comprendre à qui ou quoi ils font référence ;
- Appuie-toi sur les **connecteurs** (and, or, but, however...) afin de comprendre la logique d'un propos ;
- Enfin, si tu ne trouves pas la bonne réponse tout de suite, tu peux procéder **par élimination.** Dans le cadre de ce type de test, les indices te permettront en effet souvent **d'éliminer quelques réponses** : quelle réponse est ensuite la plus probable parmi les propositions restantes ?

Les lieux	 les noms commençant par une majuscule car il peut s'agir de noms propres ; les noms communs renvoyant à la ville, la campagne Là encore, regarde alors attentivement le contexte. Par exemple, si le nom est précédé d'une préposition de lieu comme <i>in</i> ou <i>at</i>, il y a de fortes chances qu'il s'agisse d'un lieu.




